Report Summary

- It is estimated that 45+ people attended (including 2-6 pop-in visitors). 8 faith traditions were presenting:

- Scheduled Islám presenters were unable to attend; an alternate presenter from the audience, Bahá'í Abir Majid presented basic teachings and history.
- Attendee Matthew Fomby came forward to assist with technical issues.
- A banner and two posters were placed in the room; A large event poster was placed in the lobby to draw in library patrons; Another large event poster was placed in the room door; 3 table stands were prepared to encourage attendees to provide contact information.
- Unitarian Universalist Fellowship paid for 7 days of announcements on MPR.
- The Diocese of St Cloud provided cookies; Bahá'ís provided bottled water.
- The event represented a very successful collaboration between numerous faith communities.





Hi Ron and Pam -

This is an update about the MPR ads. Yesterday at the monthly meeting of the Faith Leaders group I picked up a Report Summary from the Jan. 21 World Religion Day event. (I don't know how it got into my bag but I found it this morning.) Yesterday I also picked up the UUF mail at the post office and it contained the bill from MPR.

We were billed for 10 ads for a total of \$200 as follows:

- 4 times on Jan 20 on the news station @ \$22 each
- 1 time on Jan 21 a.m. on the news station @ \$22.
- 5 times on Jan 20 on the music station @ \$18 each.
